

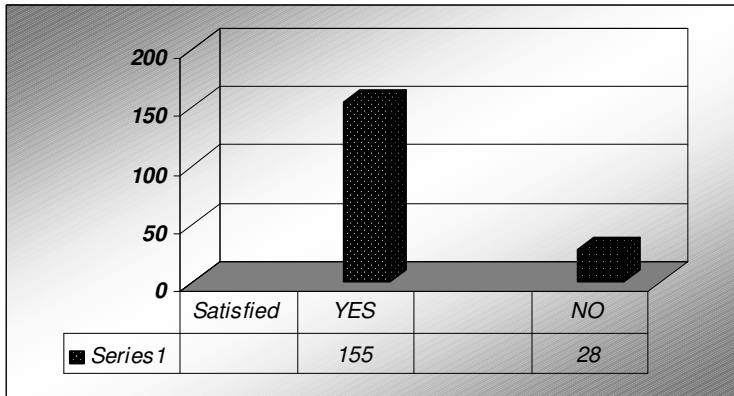
Recreation Survey results

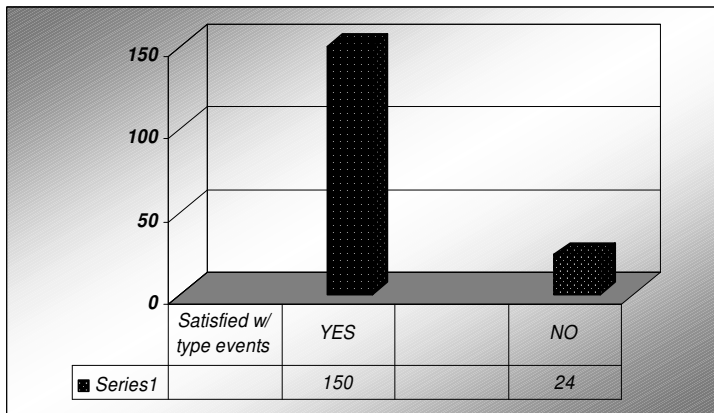
Thank you for taking time to complete the Recreation Survey 2005. Many actions of the Recreation Committee are in direct response to the information you provided.

In February 2005, surveys were mailed with the annual POA dues bill to all property owners, over 5000. Responses were received at a rate of 5.4%. Not all surveys were completed in their entirety.

Are you satisfied with the type of events offered throughout the year? 86.2% APPROVAL

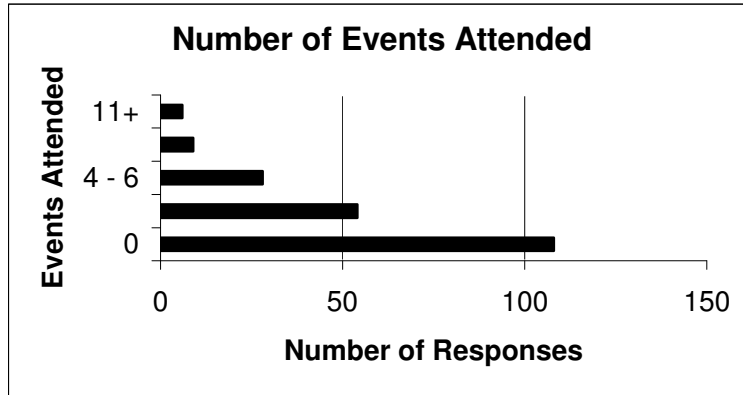


Please make suggestions of type events you would like to see (new or previously offered): Most requested items listed in descending order

Time/Date Preference of Events

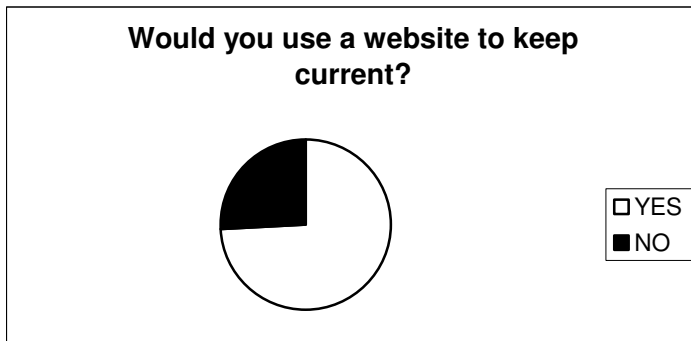
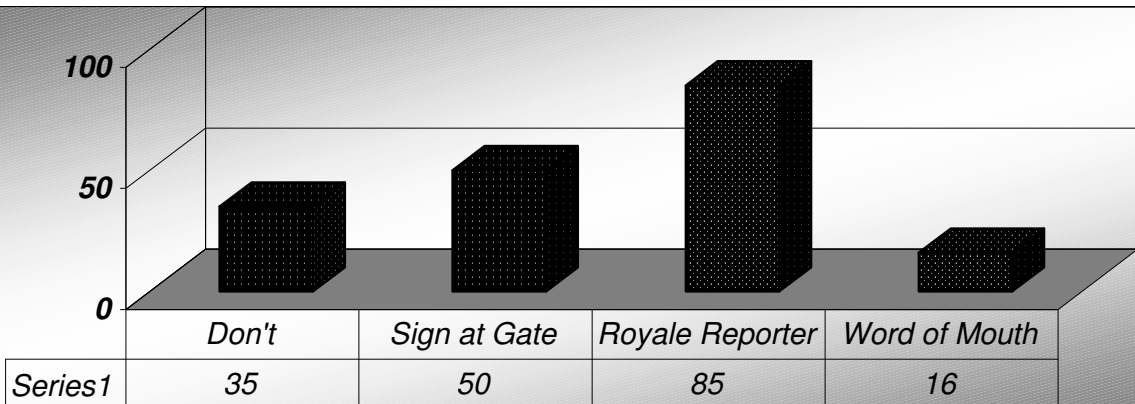

In response to the information provided, for the 2005-2006 fiscal year, the Recreation Committee added free Beach Music Night at Pavilion in May, sponsored AMVET Parade July 2, hosted Luau July 16, brought back ‘Surf & Turf’ (multiple activity event) held in August, added ‘Viva Las Vegas’ (Casino Night) September 3, , Bluegrass Festival September 11, added Fishing Tournament to fall calendar (details TBA) and again have New Year’s Eve party scheduled to be held at Clubhouse.

How do you hear about upcoming events at Lake Royale?

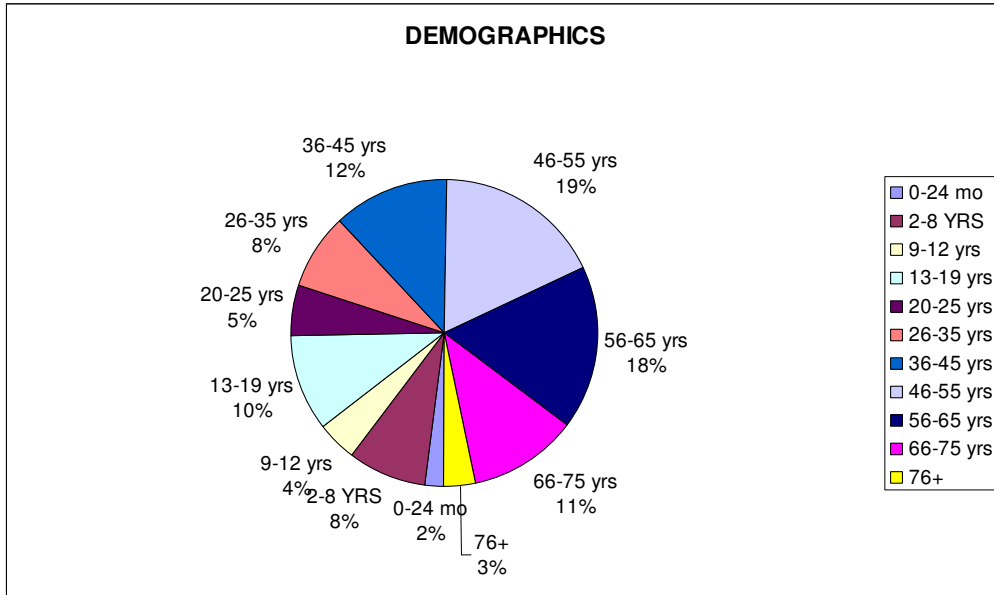

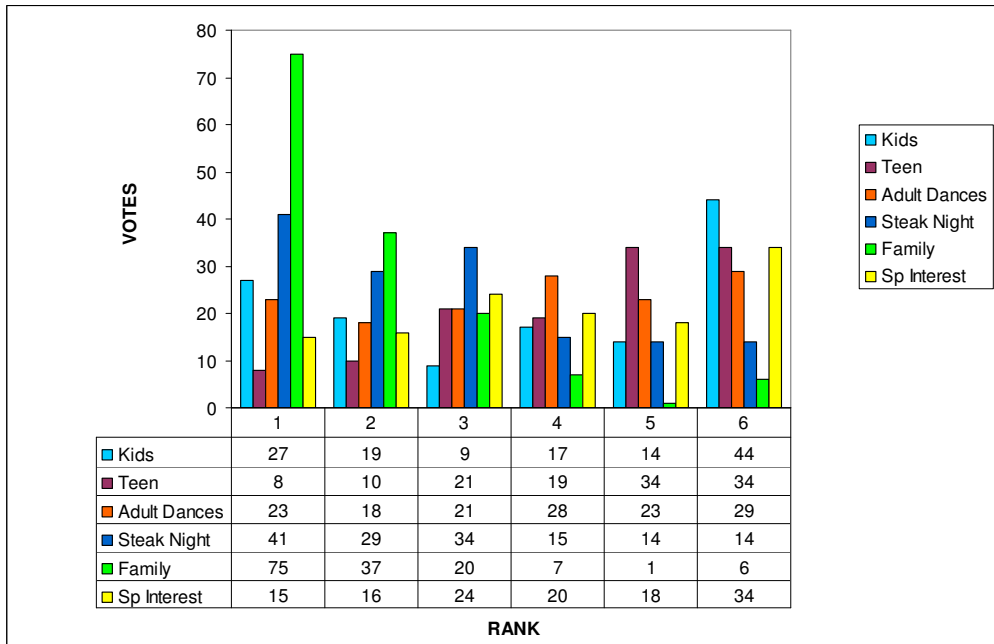

The trend clearly recognized from this survey is that Family Events rank as most important amongst those who responded followed by Steak Night. Adult Dances and Kids event seem to carry about the same amount of interest followed by Special Interest events/classes. Teen events were obviously considered to be not as important as other events offered, according to those who completed and returned the surveys.

The Recreation Committee carefully worked on this project in effort to collect and report unbiased, accurate information. Results compiled from this survey have been seriously considered and the Committee has taken and will continue to take action in response to these findings.
